## What is Hazardous at Home?



Examine various rooms in your home for common materials that may be hazardous. Be creative in your search. Look for signal words that tell about a substance's hazards. Below are some signal words listed from greatest hazard to least:

POISON = highly toxic

DANGER = extremely flammable, corrosive, or highly toxic

WARNING = moderate hazard
CAUTION = mild/moderate hazard

Substances to investigate include cleaners, auto fluids, laundry products, garden products, and painting supplies. Be sure to follow appropriate safety procedures for handling hazardous substances.

Use caution when handling any possibly hazardous materials, whether in school or at home. Before beginning to investigate hazardous materials in your home, notify your parents or guardians about this assignment.
